When? Select a day and time that works for you and those who are going to join you, preferably in October 2024. We will package special run shirts and race bags for you. We are also happy to set up an info table, display flyers about our events and programs and volunteer opportunities to get people psyched for your event.

You can create a fundraising page for your squad and even share the page directly to Facebook or X(Twitter) via buttons on your page.

The leader of your group or organizer of your "mini-run" will serve as the "Team Captain". The captain has access to log in, customize the page and to see who has registered or donated.
