In 2013, a kindergartener named Azerian walked through the doors of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Mercer County for the very first time. 12 years later, he's preparing to walk across a very different stage, his high school graduation.

Now a senior with college acceptances from Morehouse, Coppin State, and Stockton University, Azerian stands at the edge of a new chapter. While he's still finalizing his decision, he knows wherever he goes, he carries the Club with him.

What makes Azerian's story special isn't just his accomplishments — it's his longevity. He's part of a rare group of members who have been with the Club from kindergarten through 12th grade.

"That moment made me feel important like I mattered."



When asked what stands out most about his time here, his answer is simple: "The people, more than anything else. Not just the friends I've made, but the staff too. I still remember Ms. Carla from when I was five." From STEM projects to college tours, community service to judging a Club Cookoff as a guest of honor, Azerian has experienced it all. "That moment made me feel important — like I mattered."

This summer, before heading off to college, he hopes to work with the City of Trenton, to take part in a health careers program at Mercer County Community College, and intern at the Statehouse. He's not slowing down anytime soon. When we asked what advice he'd leave younger members, he didn't hesitate: "Cherish your time. I'm excited for what's ahead, but sad to be leaving. This place is home."


